It was close to 6 years ago that we sat in the office of Broadway producer Daryl Roth as she told us about a new work she was developing about the life of Gloria Steinem. It sounded very interesting but how do you dramatize a life on stage of such a trail blazer of women's rights? Ms. Steinem shifted the woman's role in society for women of all ethnicities and a mere hour and a half would not cover her 6 decades, let alone one week.

The answer came in the form of writer Emily Mann, original director Diane Paulus and video designer Elaine McCarthy. They envisioned the audience as another character. In bringing this piece to you, we hope that you will see, as we have, the value of telling your own story, listening to the stories of others and being inspired, as Flo Kennedy might say, to "get off your ass and do something".




